**Hera Abbasi** | Vice President, Global Public Policy, Mastercard. Hera is the international trade and economic lead in the company's Washington, DC office. Previously, she was a government and regulatory affairs executive at IBM. Prior to IBM, she was the Hill strategist and lobbyist for the Coalition of Services Industries. She was also a White House Appointee in the State Department's Bureau of Legislative Affairs. She was a board member of Women in International Trade and a co-chair for the Africa and Middle East section. She is also a member of the U.S.-Asia Institute's Congressional Circle and a 2017 Fellow for the Center for a New American Security's Next Generation National Security Leaders Program. Previously, Hoang served as a policy deputy and political advisor to Los Angeles County Supervisor Hilda Solis, who has governing jurisdiction over more than 2 million residents within 20 cities and 23 unincorporated communities in LA County and 25 neighborhoods in LA City. While there, he oversaw a variety of policy and community issues such as immigration, AAPI affairs, older adults, redistricting, Census, and board operations. In 2023, Hoang was appointed by Los Angeles Mayor Karen Bass to serve on the City of Los Angeles Civil and Human Rights Commission. In Los Angeles, Plata serves as the Deputy Director at LA Forward that supports Angelenos to organize and mobilize toward progressive policy-change at the city level. He also leads civic engagement work at AAPI Equity Alliance, a coalition of 40+ local community organizations interested in deepening and advancing AAPI civic engagement in LA County. In his civic life, Plata sits on the board of API RISE which organizes formerly incarcerated and detained members of the API community, and volunteers with the Check the Sheriff coalition, which uplifts the voices of families surviving the violence of LA's sheriff department. In 2020, his political activism got him elected to represent half a million LA residents as a member of LA County Democratic Party's Central Committee, and take on leadership with Pilipino American LA Democrats and the Filipino-American Democratic Caucus of California.



Angelica Ramos | Vice President of External Affairs, National Women's Political Caucus of California. Angelica is a political and public policy professional with more than a decade of experience in campaign/field management, coalition building, strategic planning, and policy development. Since 2010, she has run a myriad of winning campaigns across California for labor unions, revenue measures, and political candidates including her current boss, Santa Clara County Supervisor Susan Ellenberg where she serves as lead policy staff for Children, Families, and Special Projects. In addition to her role at NWPC CA, she serves as President of her local chapter, NWPC Silicon Valley. NWPC recruits, trains, and elects pro-choice women to public office. Angelica is also a Library and Education Commissioner for the City of San José and an Executive Board member for both the California Democratic Party and Santa Clara County Democratic Central Committee where she has served as the treasurer for the past several years raising hundreds of thousands of dollars to support locally endorsed Democratic candidates. Melissa Ramoso | District Director, Assemblymember Al Muratsuchi. Melissa Ramoso is a national Filipino American leader. For 20 years, Melissa served and advised legislators such as Rep. Ted Lieu and Assemblymember Al Muratsuchi. She has aided trafficked Philippine nationals, helped veterans and reunite families. In November 2018, Melissa was elected as the first Asian Pacific Islander female to the City of Artesia. In December 2021, Melissa was elected by her peers to serve as Mayor. Melissa has served in the CA Democratic Party (CDP) leadership since 2009. She has run a multitude of political campaigns throughout the last two decades. She served as CDP State Chair to the Filipino American Democratic Caucus and State Chair to the Asian Pacific Islander Caucus. She is the only person in CDP history to serve as State Chair to two caucuses. Melissa was also a delegate to the Democratic National Convention for 2012, 2016 and 2020. She served as the National Co-Chair for Filipino Americans for Biden-Harris. Melissa has been featured on CNN Philippines, ABC7 News and Eat Bulaga! In 2014, Melissa received the Filipina Women's Network's "100 Most Influential Filipina Women in the World Award." In July 2022, the Los Angeles Dodgers honored her during Filipino Heritage Night as their Community Hero. Melissa is a UC Irvine graduate.



Maha Rizvi | District Director, Assembly Majority Leader Eloise Gómez Reyes. Maha Rizvi began her organizing career at the age of 16 when she joined her mother in volunteering for Barack Obama's presidential campaign. Now, Maha is an active political leader in the Inland Empire. She served as the first Chairwoman for the Riverside County Young Democrats. She was elected as the first Muslim and South Asian woman to serve as a Regional Director for the California Democratic Party in 2019. She has successfully managed several local campaigns. Currently, Maha serves as the District Director for Assemblymember Eloise Gómez Reyes in San Bernardino. She established the Young Legislator program for high school students to gain leadership skills and to become civically engaged in their community. Since the inception of the program, over 150 students have participated and graduated. Also, she spearheaded the pop-up pumpkin patches for 1000 preschool students across the district. Her leadership with the Sidewalk for Safety Coalition led to securing funds for safe routes to school in the unincorporated area of Muscoy.
